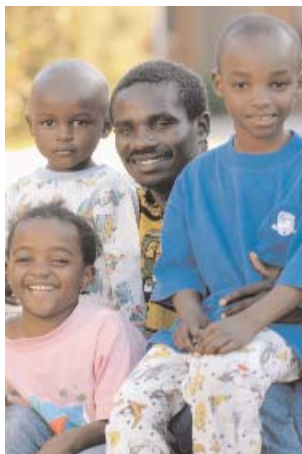
Families in Focus services for those who may be experiencing
